Water treatment plants are not equipped to filter out excess salt, so it can end up in your tap water and even corrode your pipes.

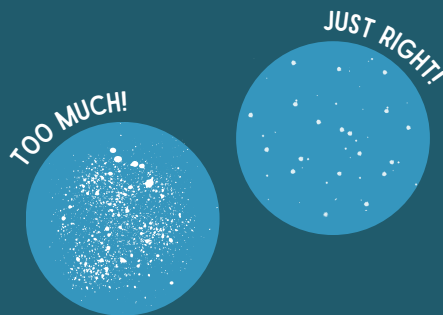
BEING A RIVER SMART SALTER IS AS EASY AS 1-2-3!

1. SHOVEL

Clear walkways and driveways before snow turns to ice!



2. SCATTER



You only need 1 mugful (12 oz) of road salt for a 20 ft driveway!



3. SWEEP

When it's done its job, sweep up any leftover salt and reuse it!
