Remembering Dick Leavenworth



Dick Leavenworth: A Beloved Friend and Lifelong Conservationist

In early October, our community lost Dick Leavenworth, a beloved friend and lifelong conservationist. Dick will be most remembered for his decades of leadership in the preservation of land and water quality in Northwest Connecticut. He was co-founder and former Chair of the Pomperaug River Watershed Coalition, Vice President of the Northwest Conservation District, Founder and Chair of the Woodbury Conservation Committee, a member of the King's Mark Resource Conservation and Development Board, and a diligent advocate for the Town of Woodbury's acquisition of the 240+ acre Trolley Bed Preserve. He was also a dedicated

volunteer at Flanders Nature Center, assisting in their acquisition of hundreds of acres of land committed as open space.

In remembrance of his dear friend, Joe Eisenberg, past PRWC Board member, wrote: "Dick led by shining a light on the path forward and creating a vision for others to follow. In doing so he created a great legacy of kindness, knowledge, conservation and compassion – a legacy we can both learn from and enjoy for the future. Dick was truly a man who worked hard to leave the world a better place than he found it and he got results that counted. He left a footprint and a path that will serve us well in his remembrance as we go forward on the trail that he forged."

At PRWC, we are honored to carry on the legacy Dick helped forged in protecting the precious and irreplaceable water resources in our community. Dick saw that the Pomperaug watershed was beginning to be seriously threatened by land development and by possible diversions of water out of the watershed. With shared concerns about the effects that land development would have on water quality and whether there was enough water available to support future development, Dick teamed up with Larry Pond and the late Dr. Marc Taylor to create a partnership of diverse stakeholders to protect our local drinking water and the rivers and streams. Together, they formed our coalition and focused on using scientific data to protect

our water supplies. Thanks to the outstanding examples of leadership these men provided, the Coalition's staff and volunteers work daily on water-related scientific research projects, policymaking initiatives, conservation and restoration projects, and community education programs in effort to protect our most vital resource: water.

Demonstration Rain Garden Reduces Runoff in Southbury

This summer's rain garden installation at Community House Park in Southbury, Connecticut was a big success! Over the course of four extremely hot and humid days, our Youth Conservatinon Corps dug and shaped the 1000 square foot bed of the garden and planted it with 350 native plants. Placed in a highly visible location along a busy state road and complete with interpretive signage, the garden serves a demonstration site for all to visit and to learn about the functions and benefits of rain gardens.

This particular rain garden has the ability to capture approximately 7500 gallons of stormwater in a 1-inch rain storm, water that would otherwise flow as stormwater runoff into South Branch Bullet Hill Brook (multiply that by nearly 52 inches of precipitation a year for a runoff reduction of 390,000 gallons). By giving this water a place to infiltrate into the soil, the rain garden also reduces the load of nitrogen and phosphorus entering the stream respectively by 2.2 lbs/year and 0.4 lbs/year.

Funding for the project has been made possible through a Watershed Assistance Small Grants Program grant administered by Rivers Alliance of Connecticut. Generous in-kind support was provided by the Town of Southbury and Earth Tones Native Plant Nursery and Landscaping. Volunteers will be needed on a regular basis to help maintain the garden (weeding, watering, and mulching). Please look for volunteer work day announcements in the spring.

A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR


Our Glass Full


In addition to installing the rain garden described on Page 1, the team also completed the following conservation projects during their six-week season:

- Cleared an estimated five tons of invasive plant material
- Cleared one mile of new hiking trails
- Conducted in-stream and stream-side trash clean-ups
- Hosted two rain barrel workshops
- Lead two educational programs for area summer campers




Final Pomperaug Watershed Based Plan Now Available Online

9-Element Pomperaug Watershed Based Plan Finalized and Approved

At the end of September, PRWC adopted the final Pomperaug Watershed Based Plan (WBP or Plan) prepared with support from Fuss & O'Neill, an environmental consulting firm. The focus of this EPA-approved, 9-element WBP is to reduce the amount of bacteria entering the local streams which are listed as impaired by CT Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and EPA. The Plan serves as a guidance document that seeks to resolve surface water quality impairments and related water resource issues within the Pomperaug watershed. This document is not intended to "point fingers" but is to help make all aware of how individual and collective actions are interconnected and can impact the Pomperaug's water resources. The recommendations in this Plan for specific projects/actions are intended to be voluntary undertakings, carried out with willing, cooperative partners, working together to protect and improve water quality. Towards this end, this Plan identifies potential partners and funding sources to assist with achieving the recommendations presented, which include implemention of best management practices, enhanced education and outreach programs, and expanded stream monitoring efforts. 
